2023 Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) Finding and Corrective Actions

Message from the Agency PREA Coordinator

Background and Introduction

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was signed into federal law by President George W. Bush in September 2003 to address sexual abuse and sexual harassment of persons in custody of U.S. correctional agencies. Major provisions of PREA include the development of standards for detection, prevention, reduction and punishment of sexual abuse and sexual harassment in confinement settings. The Act applies to all public and private institutions that house youth and adult offenders. On August 20, 2012, the PREA standards final rule became effective.

The South Carolina Department of Juvenile Justice has a zero-tolerance policy prohibiting sexual abuse and sexual harassment involving youth. SCDJJ continues to work to ensure the sexual safety of youth in confinement by reviewing and updating its policies and procedures to prevent, detect, and respond to allegations of sexual abuse.

SCDJJ continuously strives to remain a safe place for youth, employees, contracted staff, and volunteers alike. SCDJJ will provide ongoing training, education, and have official audits conducted to ensure compliance with the PREA Standards. SCDJJ provides employees with education and resources to ensure employees are knowledgeable about how to respond to allegations of abuse. The Agency continues to assess and implement changes to the infrastructure, assess and implement changes to ensure youth privacy, assess and enhance digital monitoring technology, provide unimpeded access emotional support and trauma services, provide various reporting mechanisms for both youth and staff, and adhere to staffing patterns to illustrate its commitment to sexual safety.

Purpose

PREA requires that each facility collect and review data in order to assess and improve the effectiveness of its sexual abuse prevention, detection, and response policies and training." (Standard 115.388a). This review is intended to:

- Identifying problem areas and take corrective action taken on an ongoing basis for each facility and the agency as a whole
- Compare the current year's data and corrective actions with those from previous years
- Assess the agency's progress in addressing sexual abuse

2023 Analysis/Corrective Action

This report summarizes data collected from January 1, 2023 - December 31, 2023, received from state owned and operated and contracted residential facilities. During this time period, two SCDJJ facilities were audited, The Broad River Road Complex and Camp Aspen. Results provided by the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) certified auditor found that both facilities were fully compliant with the audited standards and did not warrant any corrective action.

Challenges

Like many juvenile justice agencies across the country, the biggest obstacle to SCDJJ consistently achieving 100% compliance of secure facilities is the agency's inability to consistently meet the PREA security staff to youth ratio as indicated in Standard 115.313 due to physical plant deficiencies, staffing shortages and funding. The agency continues to work diligently to address this issue with special attention placed on recruiting and retention initiatives.

Analysis of Data

Analysis of the aggregated data collected illustrates the agency's commitment to sexual safety in our facilities and culture of zero-tolerance. The following pages of the report provided will reflect a detailed view of the PREA Allegation for the year 2023.

Definitions:


- 1) Substantiated allegation (means an allegation was investigated and was determined to have occurred).
- 2) Unsubstantiated allegation (means an allegation was investigated and the investigation produced insufficient evidence to make a final determination as to whether or not the event occurred).
- 3) Unfounded allegation (means an allegation was investigated and determined not to have occurred).
- 4) **Pending Outcome** means the allegation is currently being investigated and has not yet produced a result
- 5) *Non PREA* means an allegation was received and determined through investigation that the event reported did not meet the federal definitions of sexual abuse or sexual harassment. The event was handled by an office or entity who could appropriately handle the allegation.


